

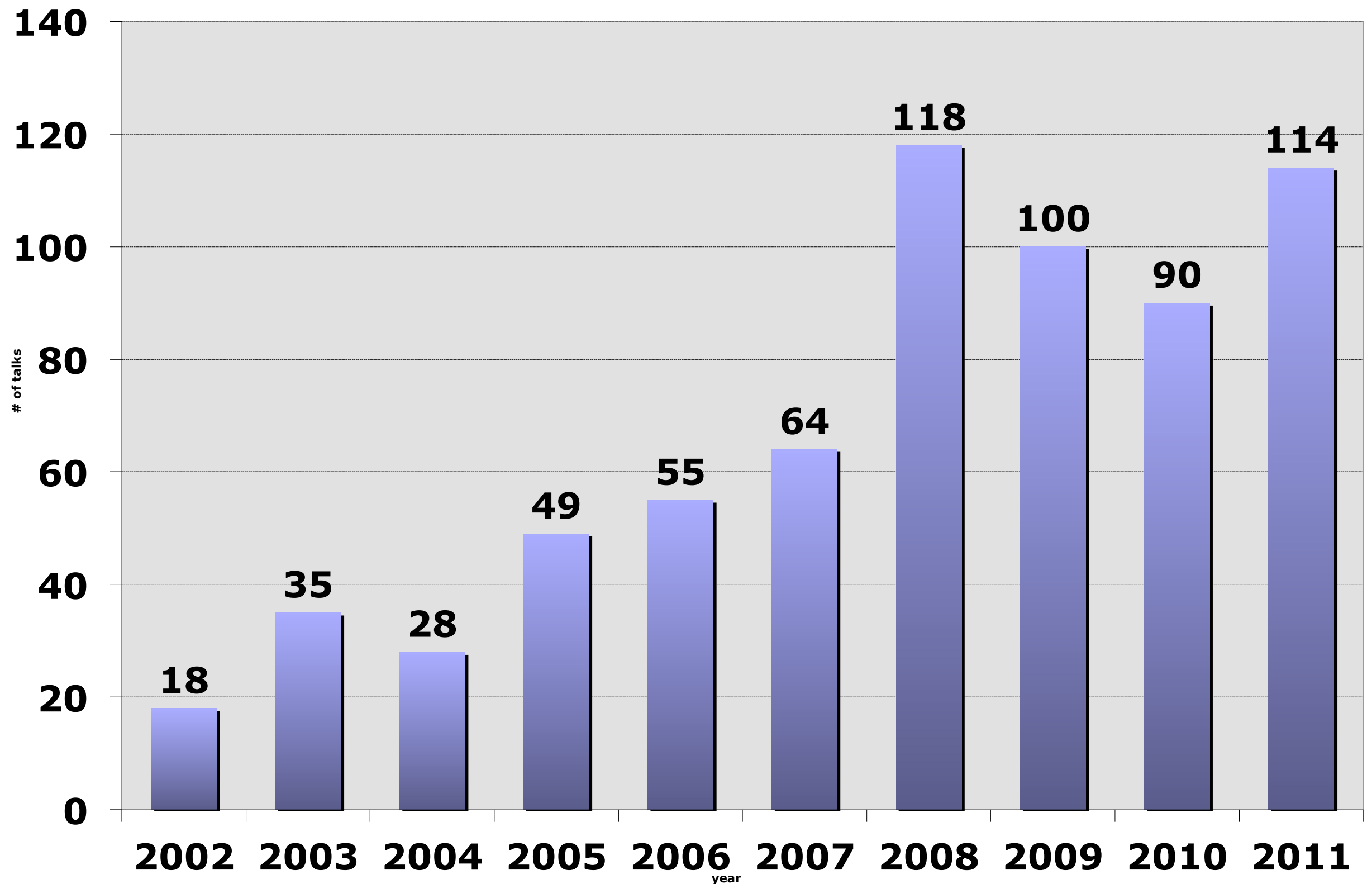

collaborator

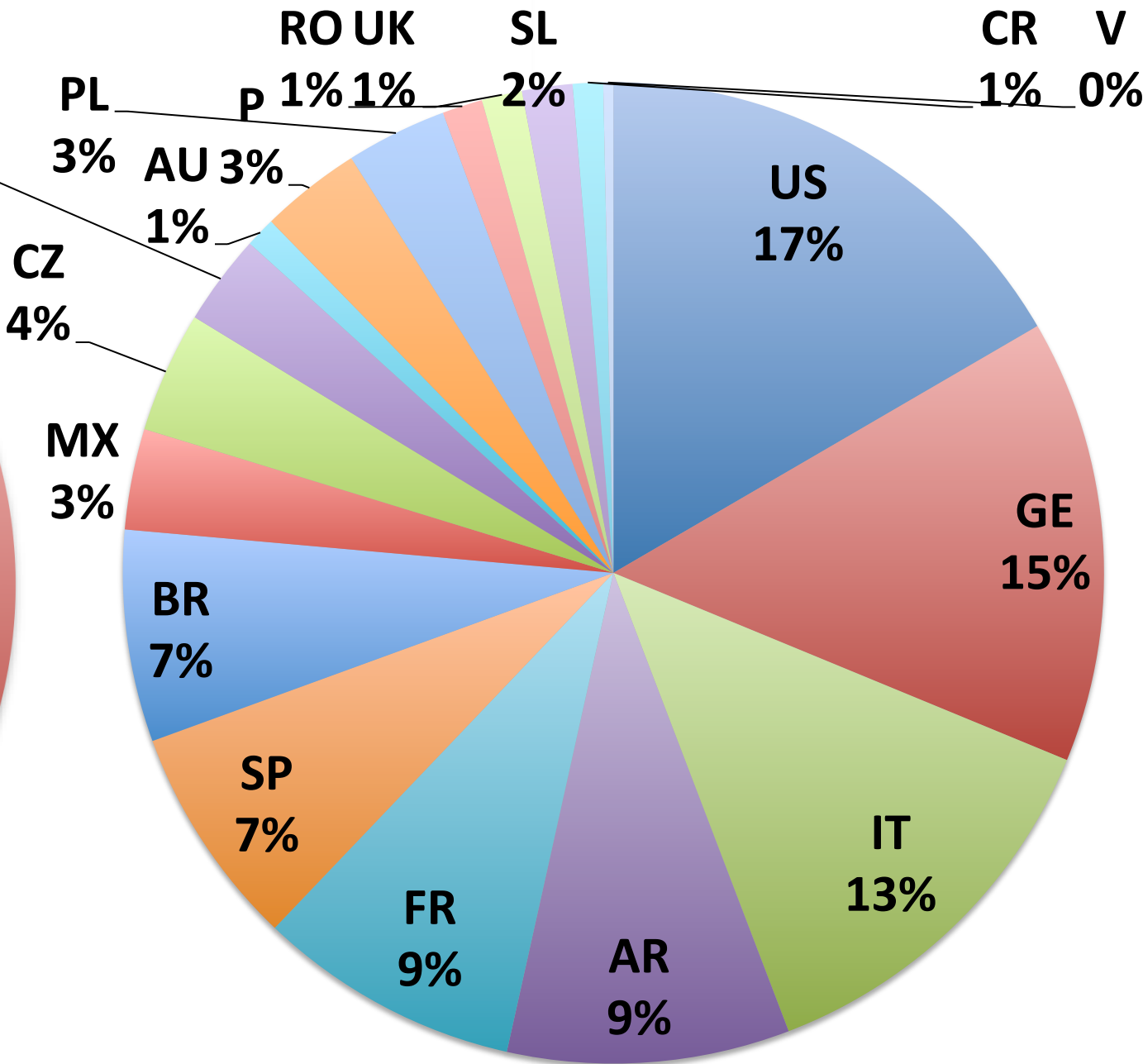
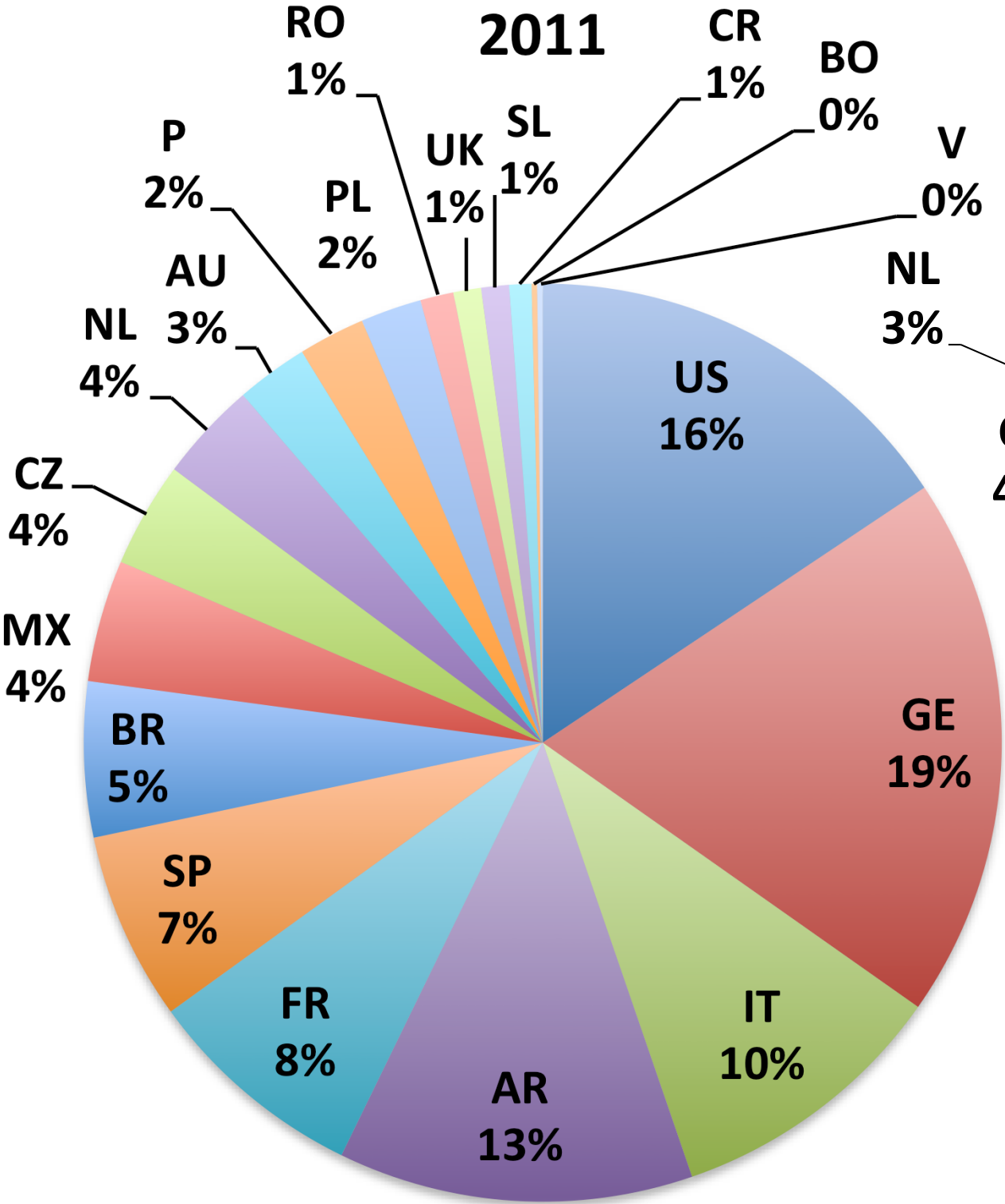

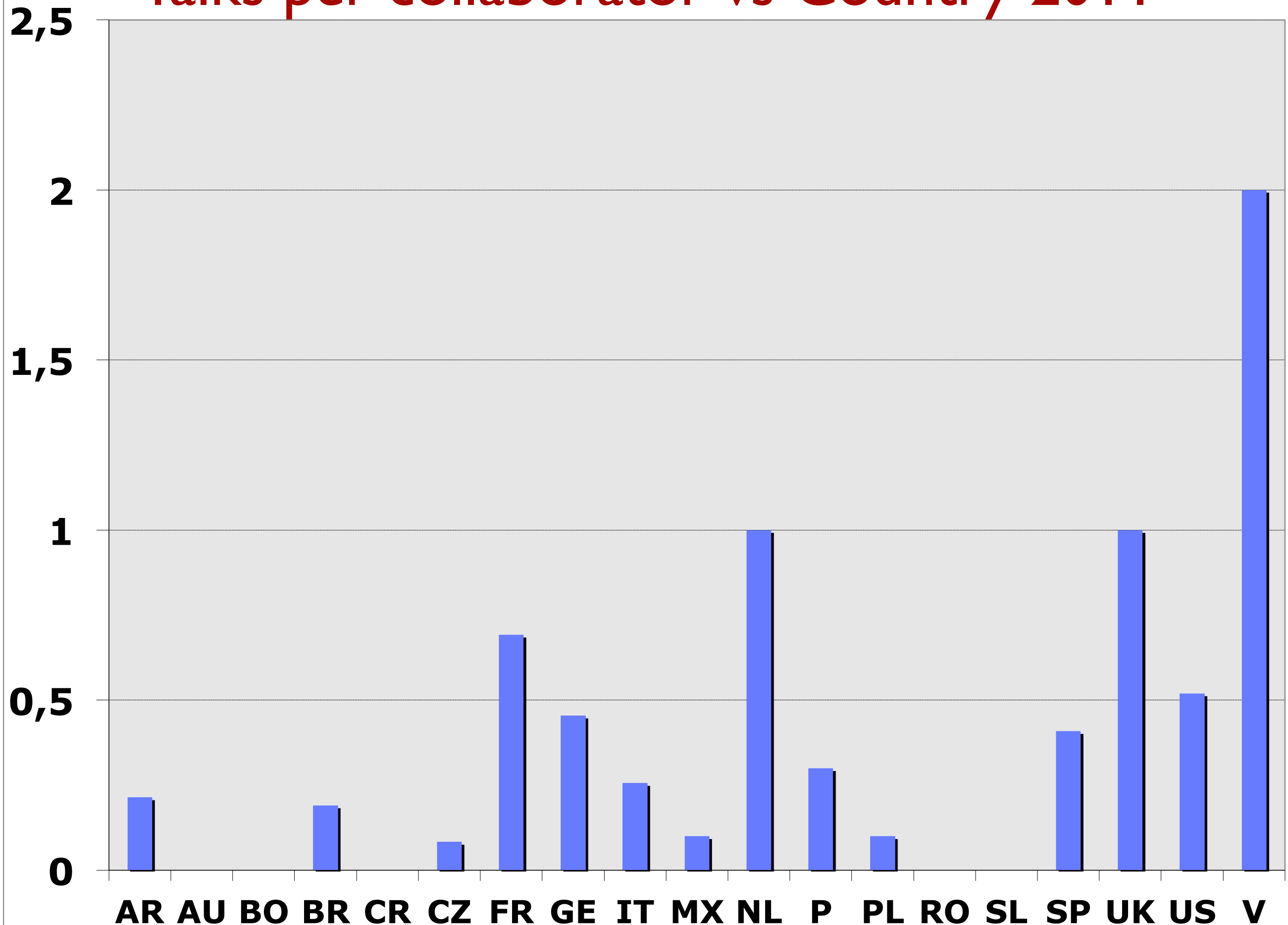
Country distribution of people 2011

According to Authors

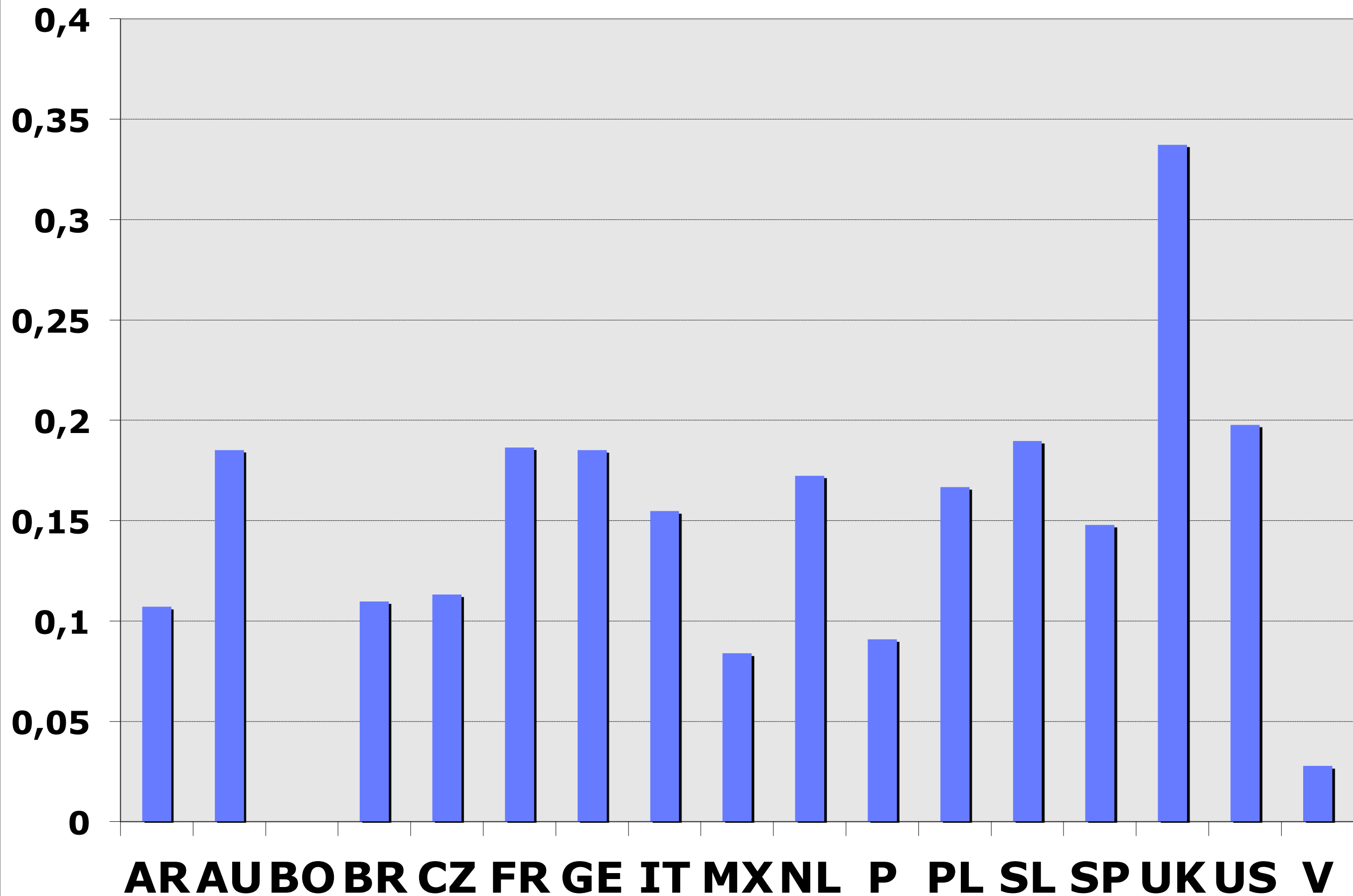

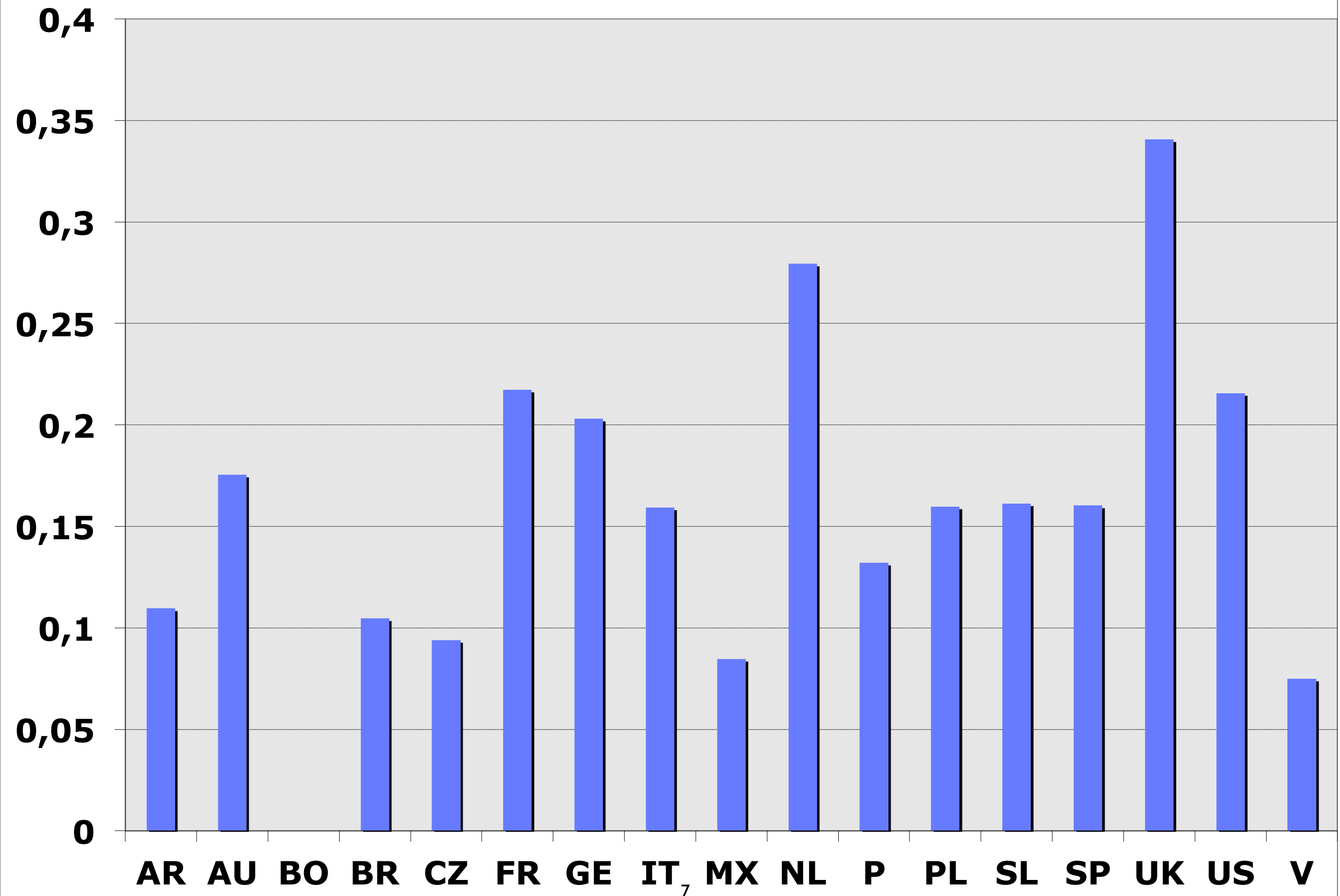
Talks per collaborator vs Country 2011
